Program code	A program code is established for all EACH programs when there is a signed service agreement between RALLY and the funds holder (financial programs)
Definition	<p>EACH is a form of flexible care that is provided:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. In the clients home 2. As an individually tailored package of services necessary to maintain the person at home; including nursing care, personal care and a range of other services 3. For a client who needs care equivalent to a high level of residential care <p>EACH supports the clients who would otherwise require a high level of residential care.</p>
